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What is Title I?

Pepperell High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Pepperell High School will provide opportunities to improve parent and family engagement to support student learning. Pepperell High School values the contributions and involvement of parents and families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Pepperell High School will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it developed?

Pepperell High School welcomes parent input and comments at any time during the school year regarding the plan. In May 2016, families were presented with Title I documents and the School-Wide Plan to be utilized at PHS. This plan is posted on our school website for feedback throughout the year. We will distribute an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I School-Wide Plan, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Pepperell High School will provide multiple opportunities for the participation of families with limited English, families with disabilities, and families of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, a copy of the School-Wide was presented at the Freshman Focus and was sent home to parents. Parents and families can also retrieve a copy of the plan on the school website or by picking up a copy located in the front office.

Floyd County District Goals

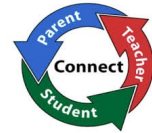
The Floyd County Board of Education sets goals for the entire district. The overarching district goals for 2017-2018 are:

Let's Get Together!

Pepperell High School will host the following events to build the capacity for strong parental engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, families and the community to improve student academic achievement.

- ⇒ **July 27, 2017 Welcome Back/Freshmen Focus:** Pick up schedule and meet teachers. Title I Compact and Policy were distributed along with feedback request. District Goals were presented along with data from the 2016-2017 school year.
- ⇒ **August 23, 2017 Senior Parent Information Night:** Parents of seniors were invited to an event outlining expectations and important deadlines for seniors. Title I Parent Involvement Policy and Compacts were distributed. Graduation Interventionist explained the documents and highlighted academic support provided by Title I.
- ⇒ **September 19, 2017 Annual Title I Meeting:** Parents and teachers will learn and share information about the Title I School-Wide Program, including our parent involvement policy, the school-wide plan, and the school parent-compacts. Budget planning and updates will also be presented. Invitations will be sent.
- ⇒ **October-Parent Conference Month:** Individual student conferences will be scheduled for Academic Advisement and progress monitoring. Student Lexile scores from the SRI inventory will be presented and growth goals established
- ⇒ **October 12, 2017 PHS Open House:** Parents and community members will be invited to “meet the teachers” and tour the school. Title I budget and updates will be presented. Student work along with SRI growth goals will be shared.
- ⇒ **April 17, 2018/May 8, 2018 Review/Revision Title I Meetings:** Parents and stakeholders will be invited to Review/Revise Title I plans and documents for 2019 school year. Progress data will be presented.
- ⇒ **Local School Governance Team** The LSGT is the method the school uses to get the community, parents, and teachers involved in decision-making to maximize educational opportunities for children. Meeting dates:
